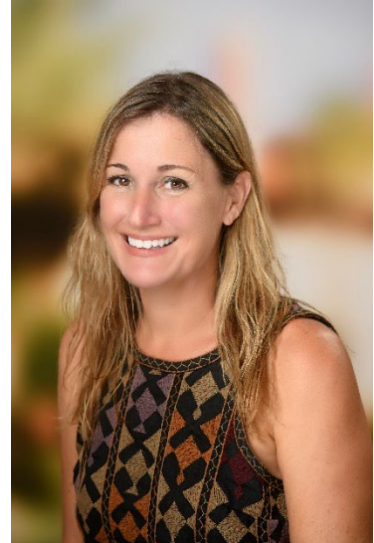

Lori Lee is Kenan Distinguished Associate Professor of Anthropology at Flagler College. She received her Ph.D. from Syracuse University and joined Flagler College in 2014. Her research focuses on consumerism, health practices, migration, and personal adornment in the African Diaspora in the United States and the Caribbean. She has directed excavations at sites of enslavement and freedom in Virginia, the U.S. Virgin Islands, and Florida. Lee has authored and edited several journal articles and book chapters in history, archaeology, and art publications. She engages in community-based participatory research with diverse stakeholders at indigenous and African Diaspora sites including Fort Mose, the Castillo de San Marcos, and the Guana Tolomato National Estuarine Reserve.



Lee is a founding researcher of the North American Heritage at Risk working group. Her research incorporates assessments of the impact of climate change and human activity on cultural resources and mitigation of these impacts. As a teacher-scholar she involves her students in every phase of her research and analysis.
